CITY OF DANA POINT**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Traffic Improvement Subcommittee (Subcommittee) of the City of Dana Point will meet on May 18, 2016 to discuss, and potentially implement, the proposed Preferential Parking District (District) for sections of residential streets on Blue Lantern, Ruby Lantern, San Marino Place, Seville, and Granada between San Marino Place and La Cresta. The meeting will be held at the following date, time and location:

BACKGROUND

The City Council approved the potential establishment of a Preferential Parking District in the Lantern Village north of the Lantern District commercial area on July 21, 2015. Preferential Parking Districts are subject to Municipal Code Sections 12.14.006 which is on the City's website at www.danapoint.org.

Following a publically noticed meeting on January 27, 2015, letters were sent to residential property owners on the streets noted above on April 21, 2016, soliciting interest in participation in a Preferential Parking District. The purpose of the District would be to discourage commercial district incursion of vehicles onto the adjacent residential streets. Where appropriate street signage is installed, the Preferential Parking District would restrict parking to residents only. Residents must display permits on their vehicles to be permitted to park on the public street. Residents would be issued a maximum of two parking passes for each single family residence. The number of parking passes issued to apartment dwellers will be determined at the public meeting.

Public Works is surveying property owners regarding their preference for the District. The City Council has established that if a majority of residents on a street section indicate their approval, implementation of a District will be considered.

The Traffic Improvement Subcommittee has the authority to approve implementation of a Preferential Parking District. It is the intent of the public hearing to consider the results of the Public Works Survey, the recommendation of the Public Works Director in accordance with the Municipal Code, and public input in deciding whether to implement a District and the physical limits of the District on the streets noted above.
