#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Craig Williamson, Dana Point, spoke regarding the Coastal Kitchen and the violation of their Conditional Use Permit.

Ladan Williamson, Dana Point, spoke regarding the parking violations being made by the Coastal Kitchen.

Thomas Volkmann, Dana Point, spoke regarding compliance issues regarding his business on Del Prado.

Robert Williams, Dana Point, spoke regarding Mr. Volkmann's business and clarified that neither he nor his wife were the residents that had complained.

City Attorney Munoz reported that the City takes Code Enforcement issues very seriously and that there was a process that staff follows to balance the interest of the people who are complaining and those who are being complained about. He stated that in Mr. Volkmann's case; that there were about a dozen efforts made since 2002 to get Mr. Volkmann to come into compliance with the Code. He added that staff had met with him numerous times and had issued numerous notices of violation and Mr. Volkmann had made multiple assurances to the City that he would take action to fix the problems and he never has. He stated that finally the City felt the need to take action so he was sent a notice that the City would be taking legal action and just this morning Mr. Volkmann signed a settlement agreement to resolve the matters and in the agreement he was given a year to solve the problems which is what he had asked for because we were trying to work with him and find middle ground. He added that in contrast the City received complaints about Coastal Kitchen from the other speakers and staff has investigated them. He stated that there have been multiple noise studies completed in response to the noise complaint and staff has concluded that there is no noise problem. He added that there were a number of other complaints that had no merit. He stated

that the City has put the owner of the restaurant on notice of the complaints and it was the beginning of a process where if there were on-going violations, the City would take action as appropriate.

11. CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF DANA POINT CONSENTING TO THE INCLUSION OF PROPERTIES WITHIN THE TERRITORY OF THE CITY OF DANA POINT IN THE CSCDA OPEN PACE PROGRAM; AND OTHER MATTERS RELATED THERETO

Acting City Manager Killebrew provided a staff report.

Mayor Tomlinson opened the public comments.

Jeremy Hutman (Open PACE), provided details on the PACE Program. He asked the Council to approve the program to allow homeowners to make their own decisions.

Michael McKinney, Yorba Linda (Renew Financial), spoke of the benefits of the PACE program. He asked the Council to authorize the program.

Erin McKeon, Huntington Beach (HERO Program), spoke of the education program that they run for the realtors. She felt that this program was an option that people should have available to them.

Brent Neben, Aliso Viejo (Ygrene Energy Fund), spoke of the benefits of these types of programs from creating jobs to improving properties.

Mayor Tomlinson closed the public comments.

Council Member Schoeffel asked Acting City Manager Killebrew if the reason for his support of this program were the safeguards that had been built into the process that should mitigate some of the concerns presented by speakers at the last meeting.

Acting City Manager Killebrew replied that was correct. He stated that he had been involved in evaluating this program since 2008/2009 and at first was not supportive of the program. He added that the County had been looking into creating a Joint Powers Authority, but back then staff was not in support due to the immaturity of the program. He stated that incrementally there have been improvements of the program, and staff can now be supportive of it but felt that there could still be more improvements made.

Council Member Schoeffel asked if the program came with his recommendation.

Acting City Manager Killebrew replied yes that he was looking at it as a state program and that it was safe enough to endorse. He stated that what he was recommending was for the City Council to consider this program that was offered through the CSCDA Joint Powers Authority which the City was already a member of.

Council Member Schoeffel stated that as a member of the JPA we would be able to provide input on issues we considered to be important to our residents and receive feedback.

Acting City Manager Killebrew clarified that we would be one of hundreds of voices, but the Council has the ability to adopt another resolution to not participate in the program.

Council Member Olvera asked how does PACE and HERO merge or is one the umbrella and one the implementer.

Acting City Manager Killebrew replied that Open PACE is the state program and within that program HERO is an administrator.

Council Member Olvera asked if the State was delegating this to the cities; why the State doesn't handle this.

Acting City Manager Killebrew replied that the State has some financial backing for this in case there are defaults. He stated that the way the State law was set up was to allow the cities to participate through the JPA.

Council Member Olvera asked about his earlier comment that we putting our name on it.

Acting City Manager Killebrew replied that by adopting a resolution you would be allowing them to operate in Dana Point.

Mayor Tomlinson asked who the regulatory agency was that oversees the activities.

Jeremy Hutman replied that there were several layers of oversight for this program. He stated that at the highest level the California Alternative Energy and Transportation Financing Authority oversees their underwriting practices. He added then there is the California Statewide Communities Development Authority which is the Joint Powers Authority that sponsors the program and then at the local level cities have the ability to opt-in or opt-out which gives them the ultimate control.

Mayor Tomlinson asked what the origination fee was.

Jeremy Hutman replied that the initial closing fee is 6.5% which was wrapped into the financing and paid over the course of the term.

Mayor Tomlinson asked about the subordination of the loan.

Jeremy Hutman replied that if during a sale or a refinance if a property owner receives pushback from the lender then Open PACE will contractually subordinate the PACE assessment.

Council Member Muller asked by Open PACE does not subordinate immediately, why they wait until a refinance or a sale.

Jeremy Hutman replied that they do not subordinate initially to keep the interest rates lower.

Council Member Muller asked when they are qualifying someone for a PACE loan, is it determined whether they have the ability to pay the loan or if there is just enough equity in the house to cover the loan.

Jeremy Hutman replied that it is an equity based financing. He stated that they only finance projects that lead to reduced energy or water bills so that increases the homeowner's ability to service the financing.

Council Member Muller asked if by adopting this resolution if the City Council allows them the ability to use our tax levying authority.

Jeremy Hutman replied yes.

Council Member Muller stated that there has not been a single statement made tonight that could convince him that this program would be good for Dana Point and that he could not support this.

Mayor Pro Tem Viczorek asked Acting City Manager Killebrew about his recommendation of this program.

Acting City Manager Killebrew replied that he said that it is buyer beware and stated that this was another option for homeowners.

## 12. DANA POINT GRAND PRIX CYCLING EVENT STATUS

Acting City Manager Killebrew provided a staff report.

The City Council questioned staff about past expenses and sponsorships.

Mayor Tomlinson opened the public comments.

Roger Worthington, Dana Point (Dana Point Community Cycling Foundation), stated that he appreciates the City's investment of the last ten years. He reported that the foundation has been able to secure sponsorship from an international company for the next year. He announced that next year's event will be consolidated into one day.

Gail Andler, Dana Point, stated that she and her husband volunteer for the bike race and felt that the City shines with events like this. She encouraged the City Council to find ways for the bike race to continue.

Mayor Tomlinson closed the public comments.

Council Member Muller asked if the \$100,000 sponsor was for the next three years or annually.

Roger Worthington replied that it was for one year.

Council Member Schoeffel stated that he likes this event and that his observation going forward is the problem has been solved with the major sponsorship.

Mayor Tomlinson stated that it is not only attendance but it is exposure on the internet worldwide that is important. He added that he was convinced that if revenues can be increased through sponsorships and reduce costs it would a good thing.

Council Member Muller stated that the sponsorship was exactly what these types of events should be doing. He felt that it was a great event for the City and that he would like to see it continue, but would like to set up a timeline when the Foundation could take this event over from the City.

Council Member Olvera felt that the public comments had convinced him that the race needs to continue.

Mayor Pro Tem Viczorek commended staff on the excellent report. He stated that he likes this event and does not want it to go away but was concerned whether or not this was a core function of our government. He added that this event needs to stand on its own and the City should not have to continue funding it. He stated that he did not see how this event was beneficial for the businesses and hotels.

THE CITY COUNCIL DIRECTED THE ACTING CITY MANAGER TO WORK WITH STAFF TO CONTINUE TO PARTNER WITH DANA POINT COMMUNITY CYCLING FOUNDATION, INC. FOR THE 2017 DANA POINT GRAND PRIX SPORT AND FAMILY FESTIVAL AND TO OBTAIN A TIMELINE WHEN THE FOUNDATION COULD TAKE OVER THE EVENT.

Council Member Schoeffel stated that he would support holding a second meeting in December. He felt that it was a small change in policy and a good alternative.

Barbara Wilson, Dana Point, felt that the signatures obtained on the petitions were a clear overwhelming outcry to not pass the measure and added that there was no doubt that if put to a vote of the citizens that it would be defeated. She asked the City Council to repeal the ordinance and to use the money instead to hold community meetings to determine what the residents really want.

Jason Colaco, Dana Point, stated that he represents a group called "Dana Point Friendly" and that they support the LCPAs that were passed by the City Council on May 17th of this year. He asked the Council to not ask the Coastal Commission to delay their vote.

Mark Zanides, Dana Point, agreed that it would be confusing for the Coastal Commission to hold a hearing during the middle of a referendum process. He felt that City Attorney Munoz should address the legal arguments made in a letter submitted by Mr. Rosen.
