- 3) authorize additional surveying services per the as-needed Consultant Services Agreement with David Evans and Associates per the Fiscal Impact Section;
- 4) authorize additional materials inspection and testing services per the as-needed Consultant Services Agreements with GMU Geotechnical and Coastal Geotechnical for geotechnical engineering and materials testing per the Fiscal Impact Section;
- 5) authorize the reduction of the expenditure budget by \$498,360 for CIP #1281; and
- 6) establish a new \$150,000 budget for a landscaping renovation/beautification project along Camino Capistrano in Doheny Village next to the portion of street being resurfaced along the I-5 Freeway, and effect funding as further described in the Fiscal Impact Section.
