15. <u>TEFRA PUBLIC HEARING REGARDING CONDUIT FINANCING FOR THE CARITAS</u> CORPORATION, 33951 SILVER LANTERN

RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the City Council:

- 1) Conduct the Public Hearing under the requirements of the Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act of 1982 (TEFRA) and the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") for conduit financing for all or a portion of the acquisition and improvement of the 17 unit apartment complex known as the Silver Lantern Apartments ("Project") located at 33951 Silver Lantern; and
- Adopt the Resolution approving, authorizing and directing the execution of a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) relating to the California Municipal Finance Authority (CMFA) and approving the issuance of the bonds by CMFA for The Caritas Corporation, a California nonprofit public benefit corporation and an organization described in Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, to provide for the financing of all or a portion of the Project. Adoption is solely for the purposes of satisfying the requirements of TEFRA, the Code and the California Government Code Section 6500 entitled:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DANA POINT, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING, AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING EXECUTION OF A JOINT EXERCISE OF POWERS AGREEMENT RELATING TO THE CALIFORNIA MUNICIPAL FINANCE AUTHORITY AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF REVENUE BONDS IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$67,500,000 BY THE CALIFORNIA MUNICIPAL FINANCE AUTHORITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING AND REFINANCING THE ACQUISITION AND IMPROVEMENT OF MOBILE HOME PARKS AND OTHER LOW-INCOME MULTIFAMILY HOUSING FACILITIES BY THE CARITAS CORPORATION, CARITAS ACQUISITIONS I, LLC, AND CARITAS SILVER LANTERN, LLC, AND CERTAIN OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO
