The Emergency Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Dana Point, California, was called to order by Mayor Richard A. Viczorek at 5:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, 33282 Golden Lantern, Suite 210, Dana Point.

City Attorney Patrick Munoz stated that based on the Governor's issuing of an order closing all beaches in Orange County, protests and large gatherings may present a significant strain on public facilities., therefore meeting the criteria for an Emergency Situation as defined in the Brown Act as "an activity that significantly impairs public health, safety or both."

GOVERNOR NEWSOM'S ORDER TO CLOSE ALL BEACHES IN ORANGE COUNTY

City Attorney Patrick Munoz provided a report.

Mayor Richard A. Viczorek opened Public Comment.

City Clerk Kathy Ward read four (4) Public Comments that were submitted to her via email.

Kyros Chakur urged the City to sue Governor Newsome for his order.

Ken Ky (2 emails submitted) urged the City not to keep beaches open.

S. Cooper asked for guidance on what actions residents can take to prevent multiple families from picnicking on lawns.

Mayor Richard A. Viczorek closed Public Comment.

The motion was made by Council Member Debra Lewis, seconded by Council Member Paul N Wyatt. The vote was 4-1, with Council Member Debra Lewis dissenting.
