City Attorney Patrick Munoz provided a brief history of the Districting process in Dana Point and introduced Kay Vinson from National Demographics Corporation, who provided a Power Point Presentation and answered questions of the City Council.

14. CITYWIDE ASSESSMENT OF OVERHEAD UTILITIES

Director of Public Works and City Engineer Matthew Sinacori provided a staff report and clarified a typo on page 2 of the Agreement that should read "forty-nine thousand dollars" instead of "forty-five thousand dollars."

Discussion ensued.

Mayor Jamey M. Federico opened Public Comment.

Marilyn Gardner (Dana Point / Poles and Lines Coalition (PAL)) thanked the City Council for bringing this topic forward and spoke in favor of passing the recommended action.

Len Gardner (Dana Point / PAL) spoke in favor of the study.

Robbie Robinson (Dana Point / PAL) spoke in favor of undergrounding utilities and stated that even residents that have underground utilities, like her, are in support.

Julie Aros (Capistrano Beach / Capo Cares) encouraged the Council to proceed with undergrounding utilities and urged Council to also consider Via California. She also encouraged additional public meetings to take place regarding this topic.

Rich Heine (Capistrano Beach / Capo Cares) spoke in favor of undergrounding utilities and urged Council to start on Via California.

Toni Nelson (Capistrano Beach / Capo Cares) spoke in favor, stating that undergrounding utilities improves aesthetics and enhances public safety. She asked that the City assist with a Community Facilities District (CFD) process.

Aaron Mendleson (Dana Point) spoke in favor, stating that broadband demand is increasing every year and funds may be available to help offset costs of laying fiber during the process.

Mike Yousef (Dana Point / PAL) stated that the PAL Coalition is grateful to Council and Staff for starting the conversation and process of undergrounding utilities. He urged Council not to turn to Assessment Districts, but to find funding.

IT WAS MOVED BY MAYOR JAMEY M. FEDERICO, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER MICHAEL VILLAR THAT THE CITY COUNCIL:

- 1) AUTHORIZE A CONSULTANT SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH NV5, INCORPORATED TO DO THE FOLLOWING:
 - a) COMPLETE A CITYWIDE ASSESSMENT AND MAP THE LOCATION OF EXISTING OVERHEAD UTILITIES.
 - b) DEVELOP BUDGETARY COST ESTIMATES TO UNDERGROUND ALL OVERHEAD UTILITIES CITYWIDE FOR PLANNING PURPOSES.
 - c) UPDATE THE CITY COUNCIL UTILITY UNDERGROUNDING ASSESSMENT DISTRICT POLICY TO MEET CURRENT REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES; AND
 - 2) AUTHORIZE USE OF THE FUNDING OUTLINED IN THE FISCAL IMPACT SECTION TO PROVIDE BUDGET FOR THIS WORK EFFORT.
